Ladies and gentlemen

We are humbly honoured to be invited to this august occasion of the department. It is not everyday where are part of the session where departments are gathered to map a wayforward for their plans and programmes for the next financial year. There are schemes which we were proud of but today they are idling and white elephants. We want to appeal to the department to take this matter seriously and if possible intervene in the disputes between farmers and the strategic partners.

We hope that the engagement which is starting should be something that we must all prioritise so that our planning should in an integrated manner as our government proposes.
