Today we are making history in South Africa and we want to thank DEAFSA for making it possible to reach the milestone. They have undergone training in Panel beating and motor spraying and we would like to congratulate them for being the first intake and wish them well in the new careers. People are having perceptions that only able bodied persons can do manual labour forgetting that people living with disabilities can also do that. As the Municipality we have gone in changing that perceptions and today we are witnessing the results of that initiative.

We are going to monitor you in new field and we will be happy to see you establishing a workshop where vehicles are fixed. We want to see your skills being transformed into a big business which will in turn create job opportunities many people including able bodied persons. We will recommend that government vehicles be fixed at your workshop to indicate to the society that the investment made pays off.

We are also glad to introduce Miss Tshepi Mononyane as our first language interpreter in our Municipality. This has been a complaint that when government is having events, people living with disabilities are marginalised. From now on, we are going to utilise her services to interpret whenever we have events. We are grateful that as a Municipality we have gone a long in making sure that the rights of the disabled persons are respected. We can upon other sectors to come forward so that we can assist them in many possible ways.
