We are here to officially pronounce to the community of Segorong that the process of relocation is starting now with full force. It has been years since the process of relocation was started and people have been losing hope. We would like to thank Rhino Minerals, Kgoshigadi Malepe and the community of Segorong for being patient while the processes were unfolding despite the challenges and obstacles overcomed. Kgoshigadi Malepe and the people of Segorong have worked together over a long period to prepare for the relocation and we hope that togetherness will continue. We would like to take this opportunity to appeal to the community of Praktiseer to welcome the people from Segorong and assist them to be reintegrated into the society.

The infrastructure to be developed in this piece of land should also benefit the entire people of Praktiseer. It is positive move because some of the projects would have taken ages to be implemented.
